YMCAs in Wales have been serving the communities in which they work for over 160 years. From humble beginnings in 1852 located in a small office in St Mary's Street, Cardiff – YMCAs in Wales now form part of a global movement, helping more than 58 million people in 119 countries across the globe.

This manifesto represents a new chapter for YMCAs in Wales as we continue to strengthen the bonds between us, enabling us to best support the communities in which we operate.

And to those young and old for whom YMCAs in Wales provide a roof – we asked what solutions are needed to get their lives back on track.

YMCAs in Wales recognise that when public services fail it will often be our staff and volunteers who are there to reach out a hand. We will continue to offer this hand to all those who need us – including our representatives in the Welsh Assembly – because we know that Wales is stronger when we support one another.

#### Accommodation

# We believe that every person should have a safe place to stay.

Not being able to access quality housing can have a huge impact on the life of an individual, increasing the risk of them suffering from poor health, educational under-attainment, unemployment and poverty. However, this is the reality being faced by growing numbers of people in Wales. This is why YMCA is at the forefront of developing innovative low-cost housing and providing people who are homeless with a place to call their own and the support to build a better life.

#### To support YMCA in this aim...

We believe more low-cost one bedroom homes should be built

We believe in the need to invest in the development of alternative models of housing

We believe more disused housing and business spaces should be turned into low-cost homes

We believe the *Help to Buy Cymru* scheme should be maintained

**We believe** the way social housing is allocated should be reviewed to help reduce waiting list times

We believe a national *Help to Rent* scheme should be introduced

**We believe** that *Supporting People* funding should be protected

**We believe** investment is needed in the housing and support offered to people who are homeless

**We believe** every area should have a Private Rented Sector scheme to support those leaving supported housing

# Training and Education

#### We believe that every person should be able to fulfil their full potential.

Leaving education without relevant qualifications and skills can severely damage an individual's long-term prospects. However, too many young people have a negative experience of education and opportunities to train and find meaningful employment in Wales once they have left education are often limited. This is why YMCA works every day to provide individuals with the skills, support and opportunities they need to find sustained employment and fulfil their true potential.

#### To support YMCA in this aim...

**We believe** additional support should be targeted at students marginalised from mainstream education

**We believe** young people should get more support to deal with exam pressures

We believe teachers should be provided with more training and support to tackle bullying

**We believe** a national *Skills for Life* curriculum should be introduced to sit alongside the academic curriculum

**We believe** all students should receive at least three weeks of meaningful work experience

**We believe** more further education and training courses should be available online

**We believe** every home and business should have access to superfast broadband

We believe more should be done to encourage employers to hire apprentices

**We believe** people up to the age of 21 should be entitled to funding to help with training and education

We believe student loans should be made available to all those in further education or training

We believe all young people in further education or training should get discounted travel

**We believe** Jobcentre Plus should be replaced with a new employment support service for young people

# **Health and Wellbeing**

# We believe that everyone should enjoy the benefits of good health and wellbeing.

Having a positive physical, social and mental state is key to individuals achieving their personal goals and participating fully in society. However, too many people in Wales, both young and old, are not doing enough each week to stay fit and healthy and are unable to access the support they need when suffering with health problems. YMCA recognises the relationships that exist between physical, psychological and social wellbeing, this is why through all our work we take a holistic approach to encourage and support people to lead active and healthy lives.

#### To support YMCA in this aim...

We believe investment is needed in community sport initiatives

We believe in equal access to sport and physical activity across the genders

We believe young people should be able to access local leisure centres for a discounted rate at weekly *Teen Nights* 

We believe local public spaces available should be better maintained

We believe more initiatives are needed to get people involved

in buying and cooking healthy meals

We believe media, businesses and advertisers should act responsibly and promote different body shapes and sizes

We believe traditionally marginalised groups should be able to access appropriate health services

We believe investment is needed in rehabilitation and support services for those with substance misuse problems

We believe a campaign is needed to provide young people with harm reduction messaging on psychoactive substances

We believe professionals working with young and vulnerable people should be trained on mental health issues

We believe mental health should be given the same priority as physical health in the NHS budgets

We believe waiting times for mental health services should be cut

**We believe** mental health services should become more community and outreach-based

# **Family Work**

### We believe that everyone should have the support they need to develop and lead more fulfilling lives.

The right start in life is crucial for the long-term development of individuals and communities. However, the needs of too many families across Wales are currently going unmet and they struggle to just get by. It is for this reason that YMCA works with people from birth through to adulthood, supporting individuals and families to flourish.

#### To support YMCA in this aim...

**We believe** the *Flying Start* scheme should be expanded to work with more families

We believe the number of health visitors should be increased to provide support for families in need

**We believe** the Welsh Government should undertake a review of the childcare provision in Wales

We believe more innovative school holiday programmes should be piloted

We believe more families with lower level needs should be able to access preventative support and advice We believe the Families First scheme should be continued

We believe credit unions should be encouraged to offer saving schemes and initiatives targeted towards young people

**We believe** young offenders should be provided with more support to reintegrate into their communities

We believe more peer-led approaches to tackling youth crime should be piloted

We believe more research should be undertaken into the needs of young and young adult carers

# **Democracy and Engagement**

We believe that everyone should have a voice within society and be engaged fully in the democratic process.

Everyone should have a stake in society and be able to make informed choices as active citizens. However, the voices of marginalised groups are consistently overlooked by national decision makers in Wales and more widely. This is why at YMCA we believe in building our services around the needs and voices of those individuals and groups that are too frequently forgotten.

To support YMCA in this aim...

We believe in giving 16 and 17 year olds the right to vote and stand in elections

**We believe** a Minister for Children and Young People should be appointed

We believe community based initiatives are needed to engage marginalised groups in the democratic process

We believe the Welsh Assembly should enhance its initiatives for youth participation in global citizenship
